Held by Zoom on April 23, 2022

25 members were in attendance – list is at the end of this report.

President Vic Templar opened with the BAC Conference Prayer.

Agenda

MOTION MOVED by Jim Rigney and seconded by Morris Brause that: the agenda be approved as printed. **CARRIED**

Minutes for meeting of October 23rd, 2021 (attached)

MOTION MOVED by Francis Richardson and seconded by John Howard that: the minutes be approved as printed. **CARRIED**

Business arising from the minutes:

President Vic said he wanted to report on 3 items from the minutes – the Huron Scholarship, the BAC Chaplain & the BAC investment accounts.

President's Report (attached) – The report was read by Vic Templar. At the end Vic thanked all the executive members for their work.

Treasurer's Report: Report by Dennis Cartier (attached).

2021 audited financial statements – Dennis went through these statements.

MOTION MOVED by Dennis Cartier and seconded by Ron Wilton that: the audited financial statements for 2021 be accepted as printed and presented. **CARRIED**

Budget for 2022 Report by Dennis Cartier (attached) Dennis pointed out that he has anticipated paid membership to go back up with in-person meetings starting again. This will increase the budget for travel expenses as well.

It is hoped that more chapters will begin meetings and send in dues' payments. As always, a request was made to chapters to make sure their information is up to date.

Additional Reports There were reports from Holy Trinity St. Stephen's Memorial, London, and Christ Church, Meaford – attached.

New Business for the Good of the Brotherhood

The following items were discussed at this time.

BAC Old Testament Scholarship – Vic reported on being invited to attend the presentation ceremony. The format has been changed and it is expected to occur in May. This year's

winner, Rev'd Brendon Bedford, has been appointed by Bishop Todd as Assistant Curate at Christ Church, Meaford. He starts his ministry there on May 1st.

BAC Chaplain – Vic had a meeting with Bishop Todd and the bishop is looking at options for this position.

BAC Investments - There was an in-depth discussion about what the BAC could or should do about the moneys that are held, in trust, by the diocese. Possibilities included using some funds to finance events in the deaneries to encourage new memberships or using funds to encourage more joint activities between the BAC, ACW and other groups working in parishes. It was reported that Bishop Todd is investigating combining deaneries into 4 “sectors” that would allow for more interaction in the diocese at a level above the deanery & below the diocese.

MOTION MOVED by Perry Wong and seconded by Morris Brause that: the BAC members give the Diocesan Executive Committee the authority to expend up to \$500.00 for each of these sectors, when created, to hold events encouraging expansion of the BAC there. **CARRIED**

75th BAC Conference in 2026 – This conference will be in Windsor/Essex. Perry suggested that it be a “free” conference to encourage more attendance.

Conferences/Annual Meetings for 2023 & 2024 – Members were encouraged to consider volunteering to host these conferences. The DEC will follow up on this.

Camp Huron Workday & BAC Executive meeting – Camp Huron is planning activities for this summer. In previous years, there has been a workday in June to get the camp ready for campers. This year it is on Saturday, June 18th. The DEC will hold its meeting at Camp Huron at 1:00 p.m. and take that opportunity to help with the work. All chapters are invited to attend & help with the clean up work as well.

MOTION Having completed the agenda; the president declared the meeting **adjourned** at **11:02 a.m.**

The meeting adjourned with the reciting of the Brotherhood Prayer.

AS YOU ARE ALL AWARE BACTALK WAS INITIALLY SET UP TO COLLATE THE DETAILS OF PROJECTS THE VARIOUS CHAPTERS WERE INVOLVED WITH AND TO DISTRIBUTE THESE DETAILS TO ALL THE OTHER CHAPTERS IN ORDER THAT EACH CHAPTER WAS AWARE AS TO WHAT WAS GOING ON AND IF NEED BE, ASSISTANCE COULD BE GIVEN TO A PARTICULAR CHAPTER. UNFORTUNATELY, THE NOTIFICATION OF PROJECTS FELL AWAY AND NOW IT IS MERELY TO LET THE CHAPTERS KNOW WHAT MATTERS WERE DISCUSSED AT THE EXECUTIVE MEETINGS. I BELIEVE IT IS STILL A VERY GOOD COMMUNICATIONS TOOL IN THAT IT IS SHORT AND TO THE POINT. IF ANYONE HAS ANY IDEAS AS TO WHAT ELSE WE CAN USE IT FOR, WE WOULD ASK YOU TO ADVISE THE EXECUTIVE.

IN JUNE OF EACH YEAR, WE ASSIST CAMP HURON WITH THE CLEAN UP OF THE CAMP, CUTTING THE GRASS, TRIMMING THE TREES, DOING NECESSARY REPAIRS TO THE BUILDINGS AND IT'S NOT TO SAY THE FABULOUS LUNCH THAT REV. GERRY ADAM PUTS ON FOR US. THIS HAS ALWAYS BEEN A WONDERFUL DAY SPENT AT THE CAMP AND WE HAVE HELD OUR EXECUTIVE MEETING FOR JUNE THERE. WE HAVE ALSO MADE CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE CAMP EACH YEAR AS OUTLINED IN OUR FINANCIALS.

WE HAVE CONTINUED TO SUPPORT MONICA PLACE, WHICH IS A HOME FOR UNWED MOTHERS ASSISTING THEM IN THE EXCELLENT WORK THEY ARE DOING FOR THESE GIRLS. THEY AT PRESENT HAVE TWO HOMES, ONE IN CAMBRIDGE AND ANOTHER IN WATERLOO AND HAVE JOINED WITH OTHER ORGANISATIONS TO PROVIDE SUPPORT FOR ABUSED GIRLS.

WE ARE PROUD TO HAVING PROVIDED SCHOLARSHIPS FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS TO STUDENTS AT HURON UNIVERSITY COLLEGE. THESE SCHOLARSHIPS ARE FOR THE TOP ACADEMIC STUDENTS IN THE OLD TESTAMENT STUDIES AND AS OF OCTOBER 2022 WE INCLUDED THE NEW TESTAMENT STUDIES IN THE SCHOLARSHIP

WE HELD OUR MEETING AT HURON UNIVERSITY COLLEGE AND MET WITH THE DEAN OF THEOLOGY, DR. DAN SMITH. WE WERE TREATED TO A TOUR OF THE COLLEGE FOLLOWED BY LUNCH.

WE ARE SAD TO REPORT THAT OUR CHAPLAIN, REV CHRIS TRAVERS, STILL HAS NOT RECOVERED SUFFICIENTLY TO CONTINUE HIS DUTIES. WE KEEP HIM IN OUR PRAYERS AND TRUST THAT HE WILL SOON BE WELL AGAIN.

I AM PLEASED TO ADVISE THAT OUR FINANCES ARE SOUND AS SET OUT IN THE FINANCIAL REPORT. THIS LEAVES US WITH CONFIDENCE TO TACKLE ANY NEW PROJECT.

The BAC General Fund and the BAC Huron Development Fund are long-term investments recorded at current market value and adjusted annually to reflect interest earned and fluctuations in unit value. The interest is not shown as income as it does not flow through our bank account. The interest is added to the unit balance of the funds shown on the balance sheet. The funds are invested with the Diocese of Huron in units of mutual funds.

Each year, the Diocese provides a yearend unit value in December for each fund.

The current market value of the funds are reflected on the balance sheet based on the yearend unit value and are reported in the reconciliation of investment funds.



**ANNUAL REPORT
April 2023**

The Diocese's pandemic health and safety protocols, prevented our meeting in person until June 26th, 2022. The traditional Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper was cancelled, however with the provincial loosening of restrictions the Annual Pancake Breakfast this chapter offers at the Meaford and St. Vincent Agricultural Societies' Fall fair took place on the Saturday of Labour Day weekend. Following up on a suggestion by our Assistant Curate and Priest, Father Brendon, the Shrove Tuesday Supper which had been held at Christ Church for 70 years was transformed to an extremely successful Ecumenical Pancake Supper in 2023. With participation from most of the local churches, this supper, which was held at Knox Presbyterian Church, for logistical reasons, raised through donations \$2300.00 for the Meaford Food Bank.

We were pleased to continue our financial support in 2022, to Christ Church, Meaford and to continue our local community outreach with financial support for the Breakfast programme at Georgian Bay Community School and support for the Meaford Children's Choir. In the Diocese we continued our financial support of Huron Church Camp, Huron College, and Monica Place.

Although the 2022 Annual Diocesan BAC Conference scheduled for April was cancelled, again due to the COVID-19 pandemic, some of our members were able to attend the Annual General Meeting, on April 23rd via Zoom.

Despite not being able to meet in-person for the first half of the year, our Secretary Treasurer, Francis Richardson, continued to effectively manage our finances. In his position as Secretary on the Diocesan Board and sharing the newsletter BAC TALK, he also kept us informed of the discussions at the meetings and any news from other BAC chapters across the Diocese. Thank you again Francis for your faithful support of the BAC at both the chapter and diocesan level.
